
PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY INDUSTRIAL REZONING QUICK FACTS




WHAT IS IT?

- In Spring 2022, the Board of County Supervisors (BOCS) will vote to change the comprehensive plan to allow for unprecedented development of industrial data centers in the Rural Crescent.
- This project includes the "PW Digital Gateway," which would create a new 3.5 square mile industrial zone on the western edge of Manassas National Battlefield Park.
- This project also resurrects the plan for a Bi-County Parkway, an "Outer Beltway" that would turn 234 into a truck route for cargo going from I-95 to Dulles Airport.

WHY DOES IT MATTER?

 Data centers promise jobs and revenue, but those promises often fall through. The costs of those empty promises are quite high. Data centers waste land, require massive power lines, and increase traffic.



- The PW Digital Gateway's expansive impervious surfaces threaten the Occoquan Reservoir, which supplies 17 million gallons of clean drinking water each day to over half of Prince William County residents.
- The Bi-County Parkway would create a new truck route between I-95 and the freight area of Dulles Airport. Traffic along Route 234 will skyrocket by thousands of trips per day, increasing the chances for traffic accidents and hurting property values for residential communities along Route 234.
